

2024 Visual and Graphic Arts Scholarship Application

Wilkes Art Gallery is now accepting scholarship applications from graduating Wilkes County seniors who are pursuing postsecondary education in **visual and/or graphic arts**. The Wilkes Art Gallery Scholarship awards up to \$1,000 to qualifying applicants. The purpose of the scholarship program is to recognize and encourage students who demonstrate exceptional potential and ability in visual arts, as well as academic achievement. The awarding process for this scholarship includes a completed application, official high school transcript, two letters of recommendation, a portfolio, and a panel interview. **The deadline for the completed application is April 26th, 2024.** Applications submitted after this date or incomplete applications will not be considered. Once finalists are selected, the Gallery will contact you to schedule an interview. The scholarship winners will be awarded at their senior awards assembly.

A few important notes:

- 1. Sealed academic transcripts should be sent to the address below:

- 2. Ask two people who know you and your work to complete the form on page 3 and send it to the address above. At least one person should be familiar with and be able to evaluate your artwork.
- 3. The completed applications and reference forms need to be sent to the above address on or before April 26th, 2024. Applications and/or reference forms received after that date will not be considered.
- 4. Finalists who are invited for an interview will be asked to present a portfolio of work for review. This portfolio should include five to seven examples of your best artwork in visual or graphic arts. Every piece does not have to be in a "finished" state. Photographs of large works are acceptable, as are art journals and sketchbooks. Graphic arts students who would like to present a digital portfolio may do so if we are given notice prior to your interview.
